

## PHSS Ski Trip Itinerary

### Tuesday, March 12

Bring to school: sleeping bag, pillow, PJ's, toiletries, clothing for Thursday and Friday, ski or snowboard gear. **Do not bring your ski clothing! You must wear it on Wednesday morning.**

### Wednesday, March 13

**4:30am...** Students arrive at PHSS with their coolers and food. Lunches should be packed and ready. Bring lunches with you on the bus. Load coolers into cargo van.

**4:45am...** Depart for Langdale.

**5:50am...** Arrive in Langdale.

**8:15am...** Arrive at Blackcomb.

**3:30pm...** Drive to Tyrol Lodge, set up beds, make dinner, play games, go to bed.

### Thursday, March 14

**6:45am...** Wake up, make breakfast and pack lunches, depart for Blackcomb.

**3:30pm...** Drive back to Tyrol Lodge. Get ready for Whistler Village.

**5:30pm...** Drive to Whistler. Students have free time to roam and eat.

**9:00pm...** Return to Tyrol Lodge. Bed.

### Friday, March 15

**6:45am...** Wake up, make breakfast and pack lunches, drag coolers and luggage up the hill, pack the cargo van, depart for Blackcomb.

**3:00pm...** Drive to Horseshoe Bay.

**5:30pm...** Ferry to Langdale.

**7:15 – 7:30...** Arrive at PHSS.

The Tyrol Lodge has kitchen facilities. Students should bring breakfast foods that are quick and easy to prepare. They can make sandwiches each morning and pack them up the mountain.

**Whistler and Blackcomb have great (but expensive) food options.** Packing your lunch saves money. On Thursday night, students may decide to purchase dinner in the village. Some students may choose to sit in a restaurant, but others may choose fast food options.

On Friday morning, it might be wise to pack 2 lunches, so that students have enough food to last until they get back to PHSS.
